Notice of Violation

Failure to submit a Disinfectant Level Quarterly Operating Report (DLQOR)

The Lee County WSC water system PWS ID 1440005 has violated the monitoring/reporting requirements set by Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) in Title 30, Texas Administrative Code (30 TAC), Section 290, Subchapter F. Public water system are required to properly disinfect water before distribution, maintain acceptable disinfection residual within the distribution system monitor the disinfectant residual at various locations throughout the distribution system, and report the results of that monitoring to the TCEQ on a quarterly Basis.

Results of regular monitoring are an indicator of whether or not your drinking water is safe from microbial contaminations.

This/These violations occurred in the monitoring Period **March 2017**.

Action Taken

The TCEQ requires that the Disinfectant Level Quarterly Operating Report (DLQOR) be filed by the 10th of every Quarter. Lee County WSC was late getting in the first quarter of 2017 report. The Quarterly report was submitted prior to the Violation letter from the TCEQ which was dated June 26, 2017

All disinfectants were and continue to be monitored on a daily bases in the system and 24/7 at all sites.

The safety and health of our customers was never compromised Lee County WSC has and continues to go over and above when it comes to disinfectant monitoring, this was merely a time table reporting issue and the TCEQ has stricken the Violation from our record since they received not only the first quarter but the second quarter all prior to the Violation letter from the TCEQ. However the TCEQ still requires this letter go out to our customers.
